Requestor(s):	BC Academic Health Council - Practice Education Innovation Fund	
Project Description:	The eOPE project will enhance HSPnet to integrate with and/or encompass tools for creating and managing online content to support orientation of students, faculty and preceptors. The tools will facilitate sharing of resources and “learning objects” that are developed across various health and human service programs and sites for orientation programs.	
Document Purpose:	To describe the “Student Experience” upon inheritance of one or more courses to be completed via the eOPE module.	

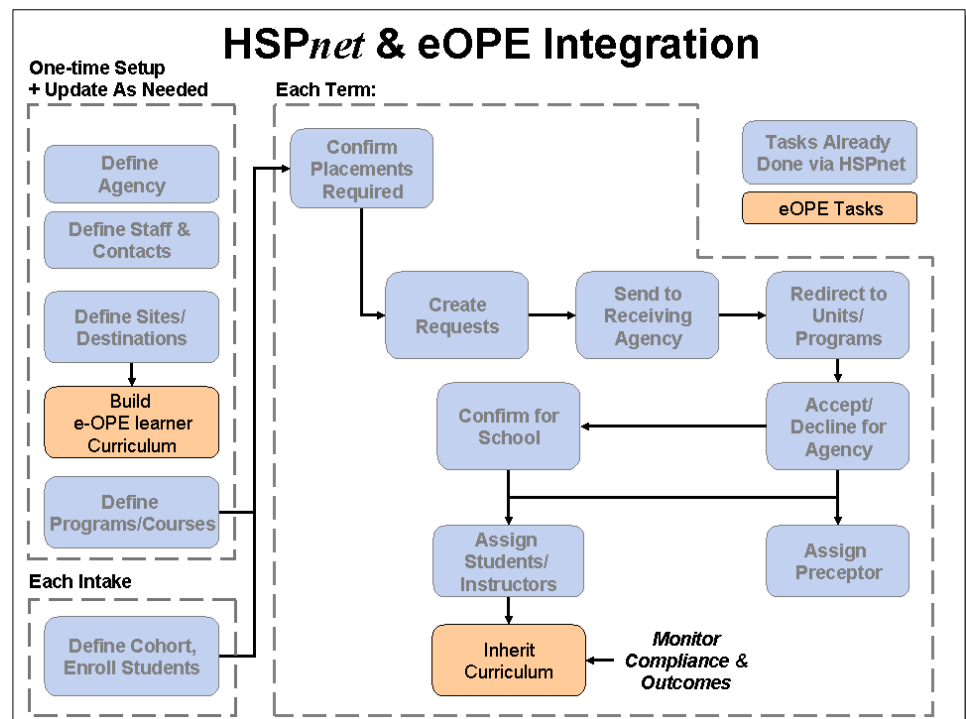
Background

eOPE activities will be triggered by existing functions of HSPnet and integrated with placement coordination processes:

Content Development – Content development may occur at the provincial or regional level (i.e. two or more health authorities could collaborate on development of a standardized e-Orientation topic), or at the local level (a single health authority, site, or destination).

Content Application – Content managers for each agency will build the eOPE curriculum for students placed at their sites. Content managers can adopt content from the eOPE repository or adapt it as a local variation at the level of one or more sites, services and/or destinations.

Placement Coordination– Students will “inherit” an eOPE curriculum at the time of being assigned by the Placing Coordinator to a placement.

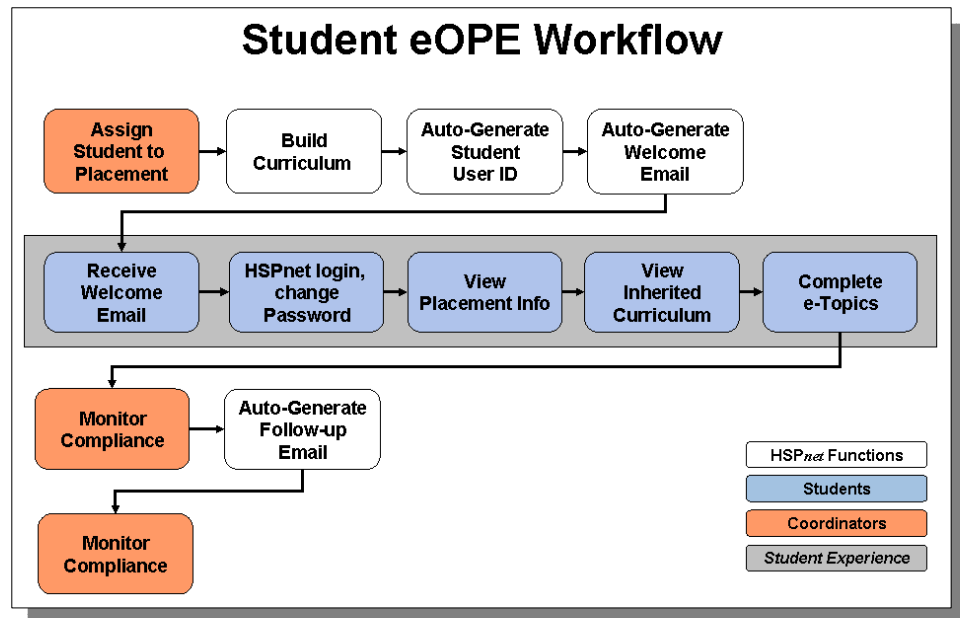


Placing and Receiving Coordinators, Instructors, and Destination Coordinators will track status of student compliance with placement prerequisites and orientation, and can be alerted to gaps or other problems.

Student Experience (Content Access)

In addition to inheriting eOPE topics based on their placement assignment, students could be given access to other pre-existing HSPnet information (such as site or unit profiles, preceptor contact information, and policies) that could be assembled and “re-packaged” in a scope and format suitable for students.

Each stage of their experience is depicted in following sample screens.



1. Welcome Email

2. Login and Temporary Password

Upon successful login with the temporary password, students will be prompted to enter a new password and to provide a password reminder question and answer (to assist with forgotten passwords). Upon completion of this information, they will be advanced to the Welcome Screen.

3. View Placement Information and Inherited Curriculum

The student interface will consist of a single Welcome Screen that presents information about upcoming placements and their eOPE curriculum as inherited during the assignment process.

Upcoming placements - current or future placements as confirmed by the Placing Coordinator, and will provide links to the following pre-existing information if entered into HSPnet:

- Site Profile – includes site description and uploaded documents such as maps
- Destination Profile – access to a subset of unit or program profiles including populations served, days/hours of operation, typical unit staffing and student types accepted
- Phone and/or email for faculty/instructor and preceptor

A printer icon will allow local printing of a one-page placement summary for the student's use.

e-Orientation Curriculum - all inherited eOPE topics including mandatory, optional, and “resource only” content. Progress in completing mandatory/optional topics will be tracked and students will be warned of impending due dates or overdue requirements.

User Tools will include the ability to maintain their online student profile (including resume or other document uploads), manage their own user account (change password and reminder question), and view a comprehensive Placement History (in their current educational institution).

4. Complete e-Topics

Links to each topic will provide a summary overview including estimated time to complete. A “start” icon will launch their access to associated e-Topic in Moodle.

5. Alerts and Reminders

Alerts to remind students of pending/overdue content could be sent manually (during compliance monitoring) or automatically (based on rules to be determined). Such alerts could also be automated for Placing and Receiving Coordinators as appropriate, although this functionality should be released in phases to avoid excessive email and associated problems.
